#### **School Times**

### **GOOSH – Changes**

Last year the community was consulted about the decision to continue to operate the before and after school care, GOOSH, as a parent run community-based service. Unfortunately, over the past 12 months the growth in the use of the service and the complex nature of operating a larger service has resulted in higher demands being placed on the volunteer parent management committee. This has included, but is not limited to, account management; the managing, hiring, paying and training of staff; ensuring the service is meeting legislative requirements; communicating with the users of the services; managing complaints and grievances; and attending regular meetings with the school and as a parent management committee. While I commend the current and past members of the parent management committee, it has been decided that the service can no longer continue to be managed by parent volunteers. The time requirements and responsibilities placed on these working parent volunteers has become unworkable. I have therefore initiated the tender process to seek a new provider.

In the next week I will be forming a panel to work with the Department of Education through the tender process. This will include a teacher representative, 1-2 parent representatives and me. The actual process will take up to three months, however it is hoped that the new provider will be in place for the start of Term 2.

Parents and students who use GOOSH will have the opportunity to provide comments to assist the panel to make the most informed decision for the community.

#### **Coulter Street Closure**

As you are aware, the Coulter Street upgrade is going ahead as per the community discussion last year. I have been advised that Coulter Street will be closed during the construction period from February 11 to the end June 2019 (weather permitting).

There will be no access to Coulter Street by pedestrians or vehicles during this time. There will be a VMS board advising drivers about the Coulter St closure in place.

To ensure the safety of all students there may be changes to which exits are used to access Linsley Street. The executive staff will monitor the flow of pedestrian traffic when the closures begin, then communicate any changes
