Greetings on the Green

Thank you to our wonderful parent volunteers who organised such a successful event and those who worked throughout the evening to ensure we were well fed with a sausage sizzle, paella and gelato. Thank you also to our Stage 3 students and teacher for running the face painting, hair spraying and nail polish stores.

Updated information about COVID-19 (formerly referred to Novel Coronavirus)

The NSW Department of Education is working closely with the NSW Ministry of Health in response to the unfolding international COVID-19 (formerly referred to as Novel Coronavirus) situation.

Further travel restriction

Effective 1 March 2020 the Federal Government has issued a travel ban on foreigners coming to Australia from Iran. Only Australian citizens and permanent residents coming from Iran will be allowed entry to Australia, and from 1 March they are required to self-isolate for a period of 14 days after departing Iran consistent with the restrictions for those entering from China. Additionally, Australians have been advised NOT to travel to Iran.

Updated advice from the NSW Government for parents and affected staff regarding COVID-19 is:

- Any student or staff member who has been in, or transited through, mainland China (not just Hubei province) or has been in Iran is excluded from work, school or child care services for 14 days from the date they left mainland China or Iran (as the COVID-19 incubation period can be as long as two weeks).
- Any confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded until they are medically cleared to return. • Close contacts of a confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded for 14 days since last contact with the confirmed case.
- Students and staff who have returned to Australia from mainland China or Iran more than 14 days ago and have shown no symptoms are able to return to school.

The NSW Ministry of Health has processes to identify any close contacts of cases confirmed in Australia. Advice about not attending school would be provided to these close contacts by the NSW Ministry of Health.

Consistent with current guidelines, students who are unwell with respiratory illness should remain at home until symptoms resolve. In accordance with the NSW Department of Education's current practice, if any student becomes unwell, the school will implement infection control guidelines and follow the advice provided by the NSW Ministry of Health as appropriate.

Maintaining good hygiene standards is an important way to reduce the risk of acquiring and spreading respiratory infections. Parents and caregivers are asked to promote good hygiene, including handwashing with soap as handwashing is the single most effective way to reduce the spread of germs that cause respiratory disease.

The NSW Ministry of Health has advice and resources about COVID-19 in English and [Chinese](#).

The NSW Department of Education will continue monitoring the COVID-19 situation and provide parents and caregivers with updated information about the virus.

Practicing good hygiene

Practicing good hygiene and engaging in healthy practices is essential all the time, not just in periods of increased risk.

Adopting good hygiene practices will help to reduce your risk of acquiring and spreading respiratory infections.

Cough etiquette is as simple as two steps:

- Cover your cough - When coughing or sneezing, use a tissue to cover your nose and mouth making sure you dispose of the tissue afterwards. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow.
- Wash your hands - After coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose, wash your hands with soap and water. Use alcohol-based hand cleansers if you do not have access to soap and water

Hand washing is the single most effective way to reduce the spread of germs that cause respiratory disease.

How to Handrub?

1a Apply a palmful of the product in a cupped hand, covering all surfaces;



1b Rub hands palm to palm;



2 Rub hands palm to palm;



3 Right palm over left dorsum with interlaced fingers and vice versa;



4 Palm to palm with fingers interlaced;



5 Backs of fingers to opposing palms with fingers interlocked;



6 Rotational rubbing of left thumb clasped in right palm and vice versa;



7 Rotational rubbing, backwards and forwards with clasped fingers of right hand in left palm and vice versa;



8 Once dry, your hands are safe.

Cough etiquette

Cover your cough



- When coughing or sneezing, use a tissue to cover your nose and mouth
- Dispose of the tissue afterwards
- If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow.

Wash your hands



- After coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose, wash your hands with soap and water
- Use alcohol-based hand cleansers if you do not have access to soap and water

Remember hand washing is the single most effective way to reduce the spread of germs that cause respiratory disease.

Anyone with signs and symptoms of a respiratory infection, regardless of the cause, should be instructed to cover their nose/mouth when coughing or sneezing, use tissues to contain respiratory secretions, dispose of tissues in the nearest waste receptacle after use, and wash their hands afterwards.

Mogo Public School is located in the small town of Mogo in the South Coast region of NSW approximately four hours from Sydney. There are 34 students currently enrolled at the school and three teachers.



The initiative involves a school like ours that has not been impacted directly by the bushfires adopting a school that has been impacted and working with the school to find out what they need and fundraising to directly support the school, their students, staff, parents and community.

The SRC will be leading this initiative and we hope our families can get behind the SRC to support a school that needs as much help as we can give.

Alex Latouche, Clinical Psychologist

This will be the first time Alex Latouche will present to the Macquarie ADHD Parent Support Group. Alex recently published research in the Journal of Attention Disorders, specifically evaluating a specialised ADHD training program for educators, which was a landmark study in Australia. He will present on the research findings, plus the implications for ongoing support. In addition, he will explain the difference between the professional health services available and how to navigate their services including Psychologists, Occupational Therapists, Neuropsychologists, Psychiatrists. Finally, Alex will provide some practical suggestions for engaging schools to achieve the best outcomes for your child.

Alex Latouche is a clinical psychologist with over ten years of experience working with children, adolescents, families and adults across neurodevelopmental disabilities, mild to severe mental health issues, complex developmental trauma, and parenting/family issues both in community and inpatient settings. Alex is the founder of 'thinkfree.', a psychology practice based in Sydney providing clinic-based and at-home psychology services. Alex has experience facilitating ADHD workshops including training over 300 educators to better support children with ADHD in the classroom.
