#### 'What works best' – Parent Resources

Our school is committed to ensuring that *how* we teach your child is based on what we *know* makes the biggest difference to their learning. As we have shared with you, our teachers have engaged in professional learning this semester with a focus on using the 'What works best' eight practices for effective teaching.

These practices include:

- Having high expectations of your child.
- Using explicit teaching in the classroom.
- Giving effective feedback to your child on their learning.
- Using data to inform how we teach your child.
- Using regular and effective assessments so we know how your child's learning is going.
- Supporting the wellbeing of your child by looking out for their mental, physical and emotional health.



- Managing the classrooms well so they are safe, positive and stimulating environments for learning.
- Making sure our teachers collaborate with each other, and experts outside the school, so teaching practice continuously improves.

In addition, research shows that greater levels of support and engagement from parents and carers are associated with better student academic and wellbeing outcomes. We also know that students learn more effectively when the home and school environments form complementary and supportive roles for learning. It is for this reason that we are focused on continuing to foster the partnership between our school and parents.

## **Staffing Update**

Planning for 2021 is underway. I would like to congratulate Mrs Kathy Gounakis who has been successful in an expression of interest process for relieving Assistant Principal at Putney Public School for the 2021 school year, and to Kirsten Finn who has gained a temporary classroom teacher position at James Erskine Park PS. Julia Wanstall's position as a Literacy and Numeracy Teaching Strategies Advisor has been extended for the 2021 year and Mrs Pigram will be taking leave next year. As a result, Andrea Stiglic and Samantha Hulme will relieve as Assistant Principals for the year. I will be working a nine-day fortnight next year to spend time with my daughter. Candice Barnard will relieve as Principal on Thursdays of even weeks and Alicia Elsinga and Maxine Johnson will share the relieving role of Deputy Principal, and Hilary Judge as relieving Assistant Principal in my absence. Planning for classroom teachers through expression of interest process is currently being finalised and further details will be provided before the close of the year.

### Semester 2 Reports

Parents/carers of all students are provided with a formal report on their child's learning twice a year. In Semester 1, 2020 interim modifications were made to the requirements due to COVID-19. In Semester 2, 2020 the requirements for reports will revert back. The interim modifications will no longer apply. Student reports will therefore include an A-E grade for year 1-6. Each child's report reflects their own academic and social achievements and growth in the key learning areas. This includes outlining student strengths and their next steps for learning.

To provide parents with access to their children's reports in a timely and ongoing manner, the school will be releasing the Semester 2 Academic Reports onto the new Parent Portal on 11 December this year. This new method will also allow parents to retrieve the report at dates in the future and will provide a snapshot of their child's attendance details.

Details on how to access the new Parent Portal will be sent early next week (30 November to 2 December) in an email sent to the **family email address** held by the school. If you have not received this information by <u>2pm Wednesday 2 December</u>, you will need contact the school via email.

A second email will be sent to the family email address on 7 December. This will include a link to register yourself as a parent, as well as a unique Access Key to attach your children to your account. Please be aware that your Access Key will allow any user to link to any students in your family at Gladesville PS. Please be careful with this information.

Once you have created your account, and used the access key, you will be able to access the portal. The Semester 2 reports will be uploaded to the portal by the end of day on 11 December.

**Group & Private** lessons are available at the following schools: Gladesville Public – After School from 3.15pm to 5.45pm Monday to Friday Killara Public – After school from 3.15pm to 6.15pm Mondays, Tuesdays & Wednesdays St Charles – During school hours Mondays and Tuesdays OLQP – During school hours Fridays Holy Spirit – During school hours, Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays (*timings may vary or change during the school year*)

**Band Only -** Students enrolled in 'band only' can only do so if they are having private lessons with an experienced and fully qualified local teacher.

**Accessories** – all students require a tutor book for band and lessons. This will be provided by Bennelong Music. Clarinet & Saxophone players will need a steady supply of reeds and brass instruments will need valve oil/slide grease. Guitars and violins will need replacement strings occasionally. Drummers will need sticks. We also recommend you purchase a music stand for practice.

**Practice** - along with school-based rehearsal & tuition, it is expected that students will spend regular time at home practicing their instrument. At least 4 x 20-minute practices are required to satisfactorily revise each weeks' tuition, perhaps more if a student is doing exams.

**Fees** – band and lessons are provided on a *term-by-term* basis with a term typically consisting of 9-11 lessons and it will be assumed that you are continuing for the school year unless you advise us otherwise in writing. Fees are payable at the **commencement** of each term and includes all tutorials/band rehearsals and performances for the term. If a public holiday, pupil free day or other 'whole school' activity occurs, a make-up lesson or credit will be applied. This does not apply to band as there will be additional rehearsals throughout the year in preparation for concerts and performances. If your child is in a group lesson, you may or may not receive a make-up lesson depending on whether the 'whole school' activity involves **all** group members.

**Payment** – an invoice will be emailed to you at the beginning of each term. We accept EFT, credit card or cash. We <u>do not</u> accept cheques. You will incur a late fee of \$25+gst, and your child may be excluded from rehearsals and lessons if unpaid. All unpaid accounts at the end of each term are sent to a debt recovery agency. All costs involved in this process will be passed on to the debtor.

We do accept weekly payments if you have hardship. Please ask us about this.

**Student Absences** – please note that tuition is a 'full term' commitment as we employ teaching staff for a full term in advance. Due to the nature of group lessons, individual student absences *cannot* be made up. As such, no refund is provided for student absences.

**Teacher Absences** – if a teacher cannot be present for a lesson, a substitute teacher will be appointed. Where a substitute teacher cannot be appointed, a credit will be applied to your account on your next invoice or a make-up lesson offered if available.

**Withdrawal** – minimum commitment for tuition is 1 term. Notice of withdrawal must be given to Bennelong Music in writing *before* the end of the current term enrolled. Otherwise, the next term will be invoiced, and you may be subject to a cancellation fee of \$25 (+ GST). **No refund is given for mid-term withdrawal.**
