FROM THE PRINCIPAL

School Improvement Plan

During last term, we worked hard to finalise our school's Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) for 2021 - 2024. We will be working towards achieving three directions, which incorporate two key initiatives. Our SIP can be read in full on our school website.

Strategic Direction 1: Student Growth and Attainment

This first strategic direction focuses on maximising student learning outcomes in literacy and numeracy. All staff will work collaboratively to implement evidence-based teaching and learning practices and use ongoing assessment data to drive instruction, differentiate

learning and identify required intervention. The two major initiatives within this direction are:

- Reading
- Numeracy

Strategic Direction 2: Building excellence in practice

This strategic direction focuses on the development of an inquiry-focused culture driven by high impact professional learning and data analysis. All staff will take collective responsibility for reflecting on their practice, continually refining their knowledge and skills and improving student outcomes. The two major initiatives within this direction are:

- Inquiry-focused learning culture
- Data literacy

Strategic Direction 3: Positive Learning Environment

Strategic direction 3 focuses on the creation of a safe, supportive and inclusive environment for all students and staff. A whole school approach to wellbeing will be planned and underpinned by proactive and preventative evidence-based interventions and approaches which prioritise the multidimensional nature of wellbeing, foster resilience and respectful relationships. The two major initiatives within this direction are:

- Positive Behaviour support
- Inclusive Education

GOT IT Program Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

To support our focus on positive behaviour and social emotional learning wellbeing as part of our School Improvement Plan, Gladesville PS will be taking part in the GOT IT! (Getting On Track In Time!) early intervention and prevention program.

The program focuses on students in K-2 and their parents and carers. The program helps parents and schools to identify children's social and emotional difficulties and supports them to respond to difficult behaviours. The school-based program is delivered by a specialist Child and Adolescent Mental Health teams in partnership with school staff.

NSW Health Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) lead the school based program in partnership with the NSW Department of Education.

Further information will be communicated to K-2 parents about the program in the coming weeks.



Our staff participated in our induction this week and the GOT IT! Team will be presenting an overview of the program at the start of the P&C Meeting on Wednesday 28th April at 7pm.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

On the Staff Development Day, staff completed their introductory training in the Positive Behaviour for Learning Framework. Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) brings together the whole-school community to contribute to developing a positive, safe and supportive learning culture. The Framework involves the collaborative development and explicit teaching clear expectations of students and staff.

Students and staff benefit from:

- reduced problem behaviour
- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- support for teachers to teach, model and respond effectively to student need
- a predictable learning environment where staff and students know what is expected to deliver effective practices that can be sustained over time

The implementation process is ongoing and teachers in collaboration with the community will be working to roll out the program throughout the year. The PBL framework supports our implementation of the Second Step program as part of our whole school strategic and planned approach to wellbeing.

Intention to apply for Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2022

Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and high potential students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. Successful students will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6. Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on Wednesday 21 July 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2022, you need to apply between Tuesday 20 April 2021 and Friday 7 May 2021.

Bookings will be made online by going to <https://www.schoolinterviews.com.au/> or via the link on the app. Use the code **7yg87** then enter your details, select the teachers you wish to see and select an appointment time. For those families with more than one student at the school, we recommend that you leave a minimum of 10 minutes between each appointment time. Once you have made your booking, a confirmation email will be sent immediately to your nominated email address. If you do not receive your email, please check your junk/spam folder and make sure your email address is correct. You may book or change your appointment up to **3.00pm Friday 23 April**, when all bookings will be finalised. Please contact the school office if you need to access internet at school to complete a booking. Access codes will be posted on Seesaw on Friday 23 April.
