## **Parent Survey: Working Together to Strengthen Consent Education**

A survey for parents and carers of NSW public school students on consent education has been launched by the Department of Education.

Earlier this year the DoE secretary signed a <u>Statement of Intent</u> to strengthen consent education with the heads of Catholic Schools NSW and the Association for Independent Schools NSW.

This followed a petition by former Sydney student Chanel Contos, through which thousands of young people shared deeply shocking stories of sexual harassment, abuse and violence amongst young people. The work underway across government and the Department to strengthen legislation and consent education is vital to ensuring that future generations of students never have to share similar stories.

As the first and continuing educators of children, it is of course important that we work in equal partnership with parents and carers on consent education. This was called out strongly in the Statement of Intent. The parent and carer survey is anonymous and available in 10 languages other than English. It will take less than 10 minutes to complete and will be open until <u>15 December 2021</u>.

It will help us to plan the next stages of work, particularly how we can support parents and carers to have important conversations about consent with their children and young people.

We have worked hard to make sure that diverse parent and carer communities across the state can share their views. We've promoted the survey through schools as well as through the NSW Federation of Parents and Citizens Associations, Aboriginal Education Consultative Group, Family Advocacy, Multicultural NSW and the Ethnic Communities Council. On the advice of experts, we are running focus groups across Aboriginal and Multicultural communities – to ensure we are catering to the engagement preferences of different communities.

The results of the survey and focus groups will be shared with this group and placed on the Department's webpage later this year. More information and FAQs are also available on the website.
